I hope you are all doing well and being kept in our Blessed Mother's prayers.

This is just a short email to update you on one or two things.

Next week there will be **no midweek Masses from Monday 11th - Saturday 16th** as I will be on my post-Christmas break. Sunday Masses will be unaffected.

From the week beginning Sunday 17th January all Masses will be Public Masses, and thus open to the faithful to attend. In order for this to happen in a safe and secure way, please note the place in the church where the Mass will take place, and the area where you can sit at each. This will be shown below, and on poster as you enter church. If there are any changes to Mass times for any reason I will let you know as soon as possible.

At St Nicholas, the church will be open 15 minutes before the Mass for you to make your devotions.

I will also be available to hear **confessions on Saturday mornings after Mass or by appointment.**
